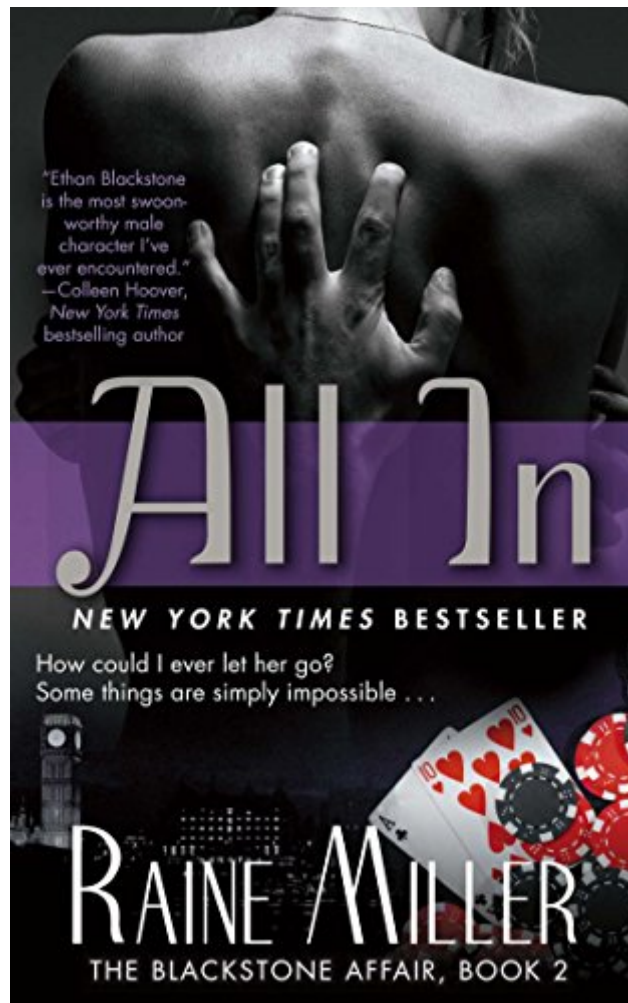




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All In: The Blackstone Affair, Book 2

The excitement in this book was pretty good, I like what is being set up and I really liked the ending. I usually like getting at least a portion of a story from the guys POV, but I'm not sure I liked this. Ethan is supposed to be this highly trained, uber intelligent security guy; but he can't get his head out of his trousers for 2 seconds to really get into the game of protecting her.

I have to say that I'm bothered that Ethan doesn't understand that he can trust his demons to Brynne because she did the same thing for him! She told him her deepest darkest secrets.
