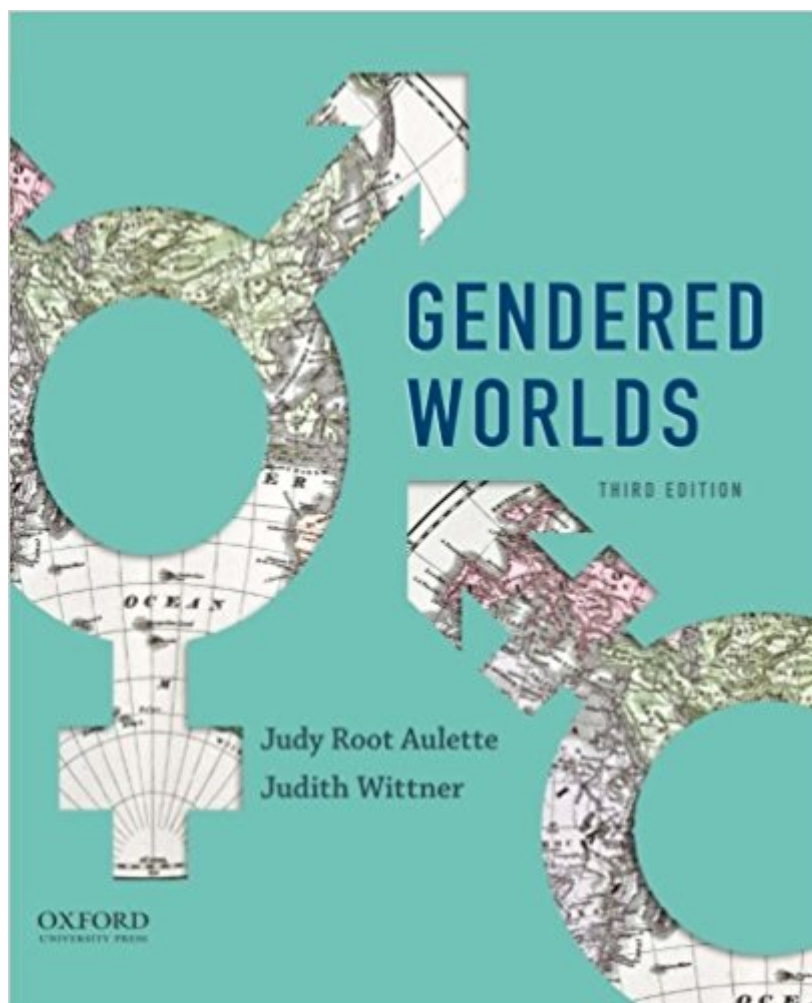

## Synopsis

In *Gendered Worlds*, Third Edition, authors Judy Root Aulette and Judith Wittner use the sociological imagination to explore gender relations throughout the world. They look at how concrete forms of gender, race, class, and sexual inequality operate transnationally; examine the impact of globalization on local and everyday life experiences; and identify how local actors re-imagine social possibilities, resist injustice, and work toward change. Integrating theory with empirical studies that are of particular interest to college students--including research on violence, sports, and sexuality--the authors make gender concepts genuinely interesting and accessible. They also demonstrate how students can think critically about gender, both within and beyond the classroom.

Judy Root Aulette is Professor in the Department of Sociology and the Women's and Gender Studies Program at UNC-Charlotte. She is author of *Changing American Families*, Third Edition (2010), and coauthor, with Anna Aulette-Root and Floretta Boonzaier, of *South African Women Living with HIV: Global Lessons from Local Voices* (2013). Judith Wittner is Professor in the Department of Sociology at Loyola University Chicago. She is coeditor, with R. Stephen Warner, of *Gatherings In Diaspora: Religious Communities and the New Immigration* (1998).

Rented it for a Women's Studies class, and I liked the book. Hard to really judge it as we only used a couple of the chapters (don't you love paying for college books you hardly use?), but the parts I did read were very insightful and covered issues from all people: male, female, white, black,

hispanic, asian, heterosexual, gay, bisexual, transgender, etc. The attention to males at certain parts was especially nice since some of the other readings in my class (although most don't) paint the white straight male as the "Big Bad". Price was decent enough for a college book rental (about \$22) as well. All and all, it was a pretty good "purchase".

I rented *Gendered Worlds* for my Women's and Gender Studies class, and it has been the most eye-opening and wonderful book I've ever read in my career as a student!
