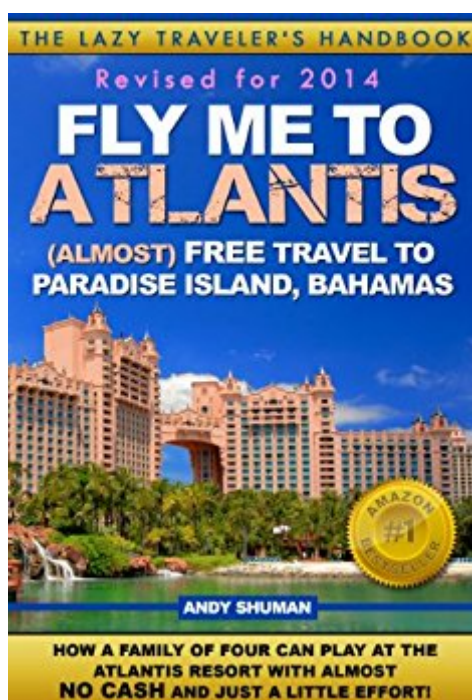


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FLY ME TO ATLANTIS: Almost FREE Travel To Paradise Island, Bahamas (The Lazy Traveler's Handbook Book 2)
