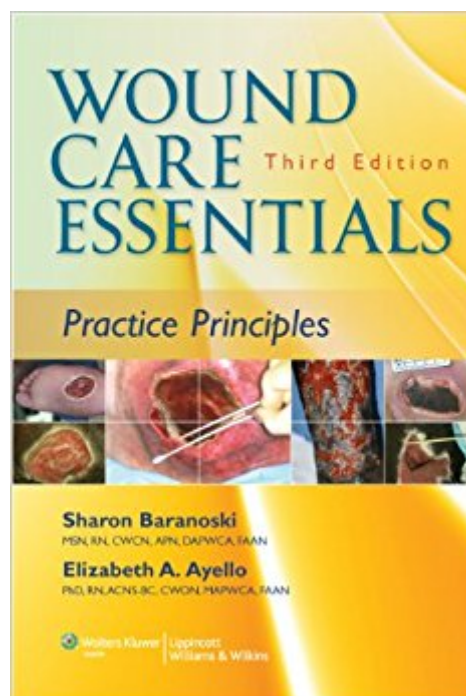




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Wound Care Essentials: Practice Principles (Baranoski, Wound Care Essentials)
