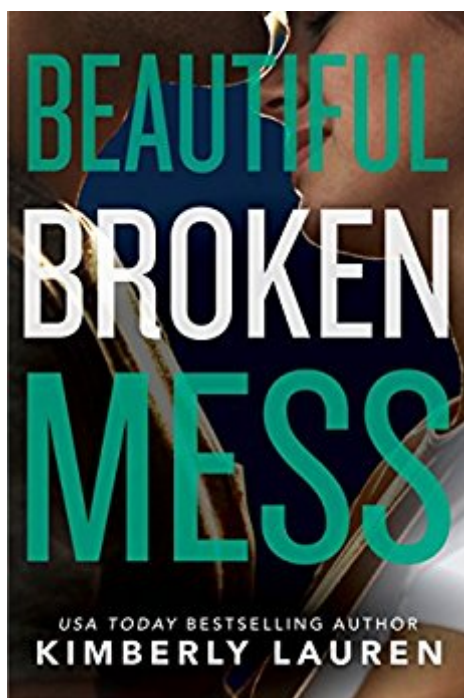


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Beautiful Broken Mess (Broken Series Book 2)

with a win. The history between Jace and Aubrey is a complicated one and I couldn't begin to know how they could overcome their messy past. But as you get attached to them and their story you find yourself rooting for them. At first you don't know if Aubrey is the villain you want to love but as you learn about miscommunications and see her at her vulnerable moments you begin to cheer for her HEA. Jace wants to hate her but fate and his heart won't keep him away from her. I also love how you get to meet her BFF Lane and was so happy when I saw he was getting his own story. The rollercoaster ride that is Jace and Aubrey will have you yelling at your Kindle but the ending is totally worth it.

After reading the first book in this series, I was disappointed that the character Jace seemed to be left incomplete (literally); I didn't realize that he was going to be completed and then some in this text. So, some hotter "love" scenes, mushier emotions, and his resolution (to have it all and then some) is really the deal here. I like Audrey's character, it's the most realistic of any of the characters in the series - even though she gets a happily ever after too. Maybe that's the point: these books are fairy tales for grown up women. I suppose that's why I'm about to start reading the last one as soon as I'm done with this review.

I loved this book just as much as the first. I loved finally getting to hear what at least one of the Riley brothers was thinking. In the first book you only got to hear from Jaxon in the epilogue. From beginning to end I was hooked. I was so curious how the author was going to make me root for a girl I was made to hate in the first book but she did an amazing job. I can't wait to read Lane's story next. I know that summary says you don't need to read either of these books first but I definitely think you should.
