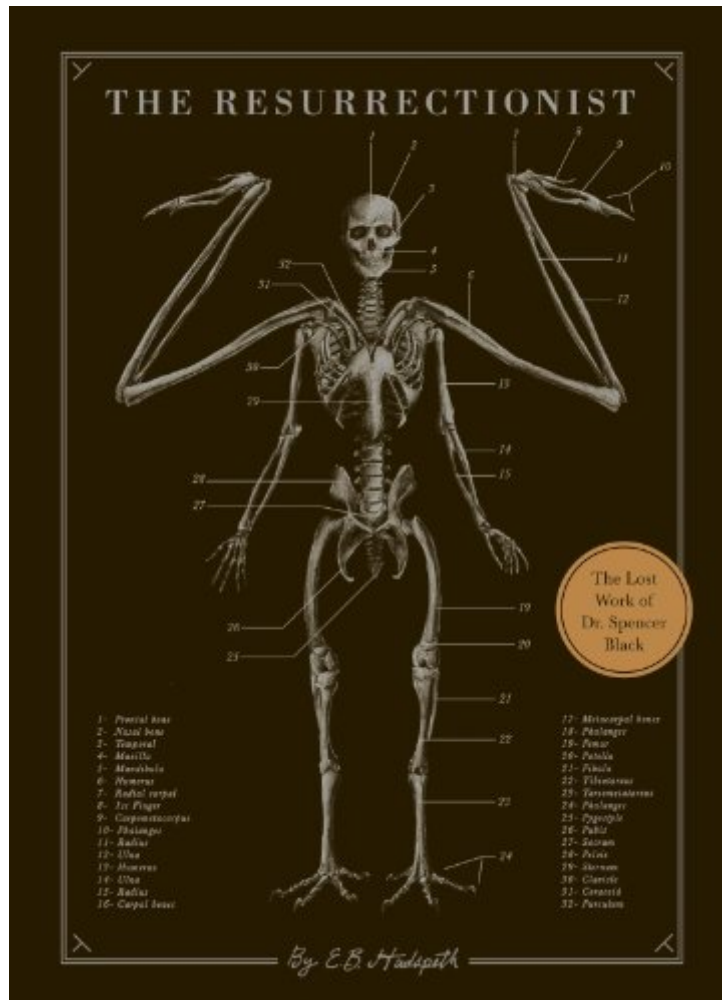


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# The Resurrectionist: The Lost Work Of Dr. Spencer Black



## Synopsis
