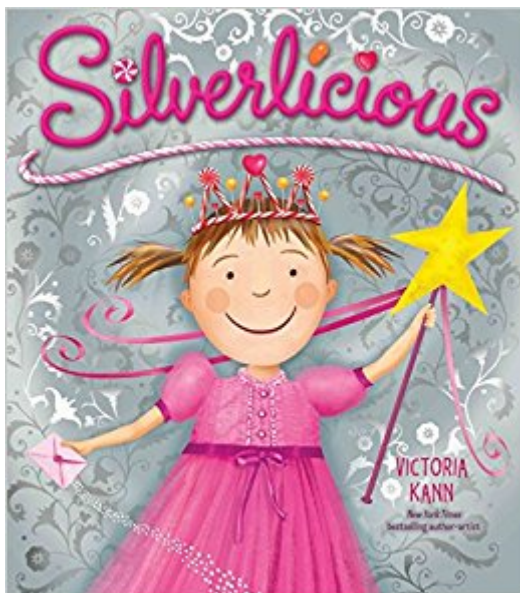

Instead, she receives visits from Cupid, the Easter bunny, and a Christmas elf before discovering that she'll taste treats again only if she sweetens her disposition. The digital artwork is frequently overcrowded, but children will have no trouble reading the emotions expressed in the characters' faces and body language. Those new to the Pinkalicious series should definitely start with Pinkalicious (2006), but the latest book will please loyal fans. Preschool-Grade 2.

As we own just about every book in the series, I can confidently say that this one isn't my favorite but isn't the worst either. Basically, Pinkalicious loses a tooth- but not just any tooth, her sweet tooth! Nothing tastes sweet anymore. She asks the tooth fairy for help but instead other mythical creatures (an elf, Cupid, etc) try to help her. She is pretty ungrateful and rather bratty but ultimately realizes that sweetness comes from inside and things improve once she starts being sweeter to people. Overall, a solid read but not the best Pinkalicious story available.

I bought this book because my daughter and I loved Pinkalicious. This book isn't near as good. I have tried other books in this series and none of them are as good as the 1st.

My 5 year old daughter absolutely loves all of the Pinkalicious series of books (Pinkalicious, Purplicious, Goldalicious and now Silverlicious). Of the first three books my favorite has always been the original Pinkalicious, as it is a good, upbeat story. Purplicious is somewhat spoiled by unpleasant kids who make fun of the title character's love of pink; Goldilicious is cute but has less of an actual story. The new Silverlicious has an interesting story, is happy and positive, and sends a good message about being a sweet person. At the beginning of the story the title character (Pinkalicious Pinkerton) loses a tooth, and it turns out to be her sweet tooth so she cannot enjoy sweet treats anymore. Because her "personal tooth fairy" is busy she gets visits from Cupid, the Easter Bunny, and one of Santa's elves. Her reactions to these visits and the notes she writes to these characters are quite amusing. The book has a satisfying ending where Pinkalicious discovers the real secret of tasting sweet things. This is a great book for young girls (I would say ages about 3 to 7). Boys might well enjoy it too, as the protagonist's brother Peter appears as a major character.

Every time a new Pinkalicious book comes out, it is my daughter's new favorite and this one did not disappoint. She is working on reading the new words in this Silverlicious book. My daughter is 6 and this is a perfect gift for any young girl. When we first started reading the Pinkalicious series, she couldn't read them at all. I read them to her. She was so proud that she could read most of the Silverlicious book on her own. For a 6 year old to read, it is a long book, but because she enjoys it so much, it kept her attention from page 1 to the end.

If you have a little girl 2-7 years old that loves girly things - pink, pretending to be a ballerina, having tea parties... this book series is for you. I get asked time and time again to read and re-read these books. Not sure how long the author can extend the series, but probably as long as little girls go crazy for the stories. Would start with the flagship book Pinkalicious.

My daughter wanted this book to add to her collections of Pinkalicious. We have read this book countless times before she went to bed.

We just love this book. This is the cutest twist on being polite. Each page is just a delight. Our other pinkalicious books have been fun, but we never get enough of Silverlicious. We've read this one the most of all. The illustrations on each page are just delightful and the humorous twist on words in the letters is a treat for the parents and the kids. Of course if you are anti tooth fairy, easter bunny, cupid, santa clause, etc., then this is not the book for you. This book just brings smiles to everyone in our family.
