

A former chair of Hamline's psychology department at Hamline University, Dr. Hergenhahn has been awarded for excellence in teaching, has authored several widely adopted textbooks and numerous journal articles. Tracy Henley earned his Psychology Ph.D. at the University of Tennessee, where he co-edited his first book, *REFLECTIONS ON THE PRINCIPLES OF PSYCHOLOGY: WILLIAM JAMES AFTER A CENTURY*. He also co-authored *THE PHENOMENOLOGY OF EVERYDAY LIFE* and *CONNECTIONS IN THE HISTORY AND SYSTEMS OF PSYCHOLOGY*; has written more than 75 publications in the areas of history, methods, psycholinguistics and social cognition; and has worked on numerous federal research grants. Dr. Henley spent 13 years on the faculty at Mississippi State University, teaching and conducting research in Philosophy and Psychology. In 2001, he spent his first sabbatical working for a computer games company, and still dabbles in game design. He accepted the position of Head of the Department of Psychology and Special Education at Texas A & M University-Commerce in 2003. He has also served as Director of Grants and Research for the College of Education and Human Services. He was elected President of the Southwestern Psychological Association in 2012.

Although this book does appear to be a who's-who of psychology's history, it does shed tons of light into how current psychological thought developed. Even so, it is NOT a light read and can be tedious at points. I found it highly interesting for my doctoral class in the foundations of psychological thought. If you are interested in how modern psychology came to be, this is the book for you. However, if you are a lay person who is looking for a light read, definitely NOT recommended as it is dense.

The Kindle version is incomplete. Most of it is available, but I've run into a handful of grey boxes in-text that say "Text not available due to copyright restrictions." From what I can tell it's blocking out some pictures and some quotes--non-essential items--of the text. However, I do not know for sure since I do not have access. So beware. If you get the Kindle version, you will be able to read most of it without issue. However, should at least tell buyers that the book is incomplete with its description of the text.

This review specifically refers to the Kindle addition. The text contains several quotes that have been blocked out as "Text not available due to copyright restrictions." This is no more acceptable in a digital textbook as it would be a print textbook.

I really like this book. It is very comprehensive and also offers "suggestions for further reading" at the end of each chapter. While this text is more interesting than other textbooks I've had, the book itself had few vulgar writings written in it via other students and the binding of the book was completely unattached on one side. Not the quality I would expect for renting a textbook.
