

And Garnet surprised me in this one and I'm definitely a big fan. He is quickly becoming one of my favorite characters in the series. Oh and Lucien. Like I said, this one just keeps going from beginning to end and I really enjoyed that. And then the ending just drops on a dime and will leave you reeling for the next book. If I had to touch on one drawback it would be Violet and Ash's relationship. They seem very devoted to each other and yet their relationship seems very superficial. I guess I don't really understand why she loves him so much. However, this is consistent with the first book, and it is nice to not have to read a book where the

relationship is so dominant that it takes away from the more action packed parts of the story. It's been awhile since I've read a book that has made time stand still with the intensity of the moment the way the excellently crafted moments in The White Rose did.
