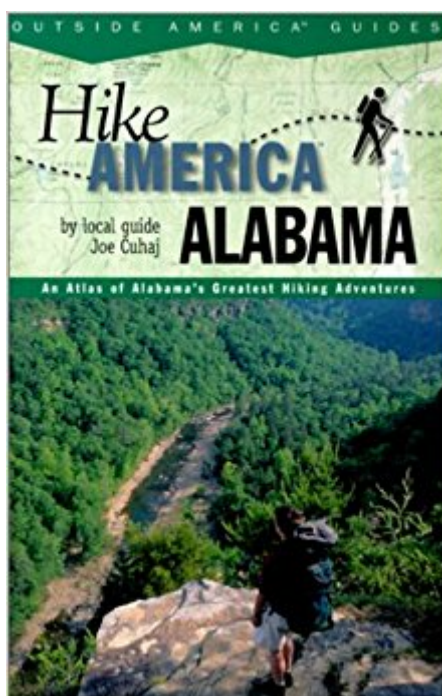

Great book for hiking in Alabama. The book is divided into state sections. It has numerous trails of varying difficulty; from short strolls to multiple day backpacking adventures. Each trail includes maps; directions; summaries; trail descriptions; terrain maps showing you the altitude ascent/descent of each trail. It has landmarks/big views labeled on the maps. It also includes other 'honorable mention trails' for each different section of the state not fully covered in the book. It is applicable to all levels

of hiker; from beginner to professional.. If you are contemplating buying this book; do it. You will not regret it.

The state of Alabama is a natural wonder. From clear gulf waters kissed by blindingly beautiful white sand beaches, to rugged canyons and graceful mountains, Alabama truly has it all. Joe Cuhaj's book "Hike America: Alabama," covers enough trailblazing experiences in this well written and easy to follow guidebook to last a lifetime. The maps are clearly drawn and the text contains a wealth of information on everything from the local flora and fauna to the best restaurants in the area.
